The school year has been marked by significant academic achievements, staff development, and vibrant student engagement across academics and co-curricular activities.

Key Highlights & Achievements

- **Academic Excellence:** The school achieved a 100 % pass percentage in the Grade 10 CBSE Board Examinations, securing **1st place at the taluk level**. Out of 79 students, 33 achieved Distinction, 36 secured First Class, and 10 secured Second Class.
- **School Growth & Operations:** Total student enrollment has grown to **1,275 students**, supported by 53 teaching staff, 4 office staff, 18 drivers, and 21 helpers.
- **Institutional Recognition:** Awarded the **21st Century Innovative School Award** by LogIQids for innovation and educational excellence.
- **Scouts & Guides:** Students earned an Excellent March Past Certificate at the District-Level Training Camp, while three teachers completed specialized training in Scouts, Guides, and Bulbul.
- **Teacher Achievements:** Teachers secured **1st Prize in the Treasure Hunt Competition** organized by CBSE Mysore Sahodaya, with further competitions ongoing.
