Considering the need of the Asian countries, the Society spread to Indonesia in 1898 and to India 1904. The vision of the society is to give quality education, especially to girl children, medical care for the vulnerable and for physically challenged and aged people. In India, we have four provinces, with 120 communities around 850 sisters are working day in day out in all over India.
